Wastewater Project Update

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has issued a tentative approval of the Plans and Specifications based upon the receipt of all easements required for the project. The engineers, town attorney and property owners are all working to acquire the necessary easements. Our goal is to finalize all easements and put the project out for bids by mid-summer.

It has been brought to the attention of the engineers and town attorney that many of the property lines shown on the plans and the individual easements appear to be in error. The location of the property lines was determined using the Plat Maps taken from the Steuben County courthouse.

We are actively researching these situations and trying to determine the best way possible to rewrite the effected easements in such a way as to not reference the property lines. Many of you will be receiving revised ease-

Clear Lake Community Endowment Makes First Grants

The Clear Lake Community Endowment Board has approved the distribution of \$8,000 for grant requests from the Clear Lake community. The funds are a part of the \$12,500 received from the 2000 Steuben County Foundations 5 to 1 matching funds challenge.

A \$2,500 grant was awarded to The Clear Lake Land Conservancy for land purchases; \$1,500 was awarded to the Clear Lake Association for swim buoys and other community projects; \$1,000 was awarded to the Clear Lake Lions Club for community projects; \$500 was awarded to the Clear Lake Ski Club for equipment; and \$500 scholarships were awarded to Chris Hughs, Brent Schlosser, Haley Geiger, Billy Scheumann and Judy Johnson.

The Steuben County Community Foundation is sponsoring a "Share Our Success Challenge for this year. The Foundation will match each dollar raised with fifty cents, up to a maximum of \$5,000. 
Marshal's Memo

To: All Boaters
Re: Indiana Laws

Indiana law requires that all boat trailers must be registered if to be towed on a public roadway (even if just from the cottage to the public ramp and back twice a year). The penalty for non-compliance is quite steep and not worth the risk!

Also, all sailboats must have registration decals just like powerboats.

Finally, the percentage of alcohol concentration equivalent in a person's blood or breath necessary to constitute prima facie evi-



dence of intoxication when operating a motor vehicle or watercraft is at least 0.05% but less than 0.08%. This change in the Indiana law is effective July 1, 2001.
